GLS has always been privileged to have inspiring personalities visit its campus. Beginning this issue, we present a new column – “Khulla Dile” – where we interact with our special guests and try to find out their thoughts on some profound, sensitive issues.

“REMOVE THE CONCEPT OF FEAR”

SMT. ANANDIBEN PATEL, HON. CHIEF MINISTER, GUJARAT STATE

Ma’am, you are from the field of education yourself. What would you say to teachers today? Do they need to change their approach?

Teachers need to understand students’ needs. They need to go to the level of the child, make him/her comfortable and then try to teach him/her about concepts. The approach should be of giving utmost priority to the child’s well-being.

You have completed your education as the only girl in the class full of boys and reached to the position of the first lady CM of Gujarat. The situation has improved but the ratio of girls in higher education is still low, especially in fields such as medicine, engineering, etc. What can be

done to change the situation?

Our government has been taking steps to increase the ratio of girls in higher education. We have created policies where girls are getting free primary education. But it is also up to the family to encourage girls. Today the scenario is that girls from certain sections of the society lag behind in education because the family members are more worried about how she will get a husband rather than her education and career. Therefore, it is firstly the family’s responsibility to use the facilities provided by the government and give their daughters primary education with sincerity.

Also, girls should be encouraged to take up subjects of mathematics and science. We



see a trend of girls going into arts and commerce, not because of their liking, but because of family pressure. Once more and more girls develop interest in these subjects, we will see an improvement in the ratio in medical, engineering and other

professional fields.

Ma’am, you are an inspiration to us because of your famous act of bravery. Not everyone gets such an opportunity to show their bravery. How do you define bravery in modern times? And how can every

young person be courageous in his/her own life?

I believe that bravery is a very personal concept and situation-dependent. It is also related to every individual’s concept of fear. Ever since a child is small, parents start instilling fear in the his/her mind - ‘don’t go out in the dark’ or even by showing false fear – ‘If you don’t eat, I will call the police’ etc. A child raised on a diet of fear from an early age grows into an adult who does not know how to react in a difficult situation.

So in order to inculcate bravery and courage in the youth, we as parents, teachers and elders will first have to remove the concept of fear from their minds.

“KNOWING ONESELF”

Pujya Brahmvihari Swamiji, BAPS

What are your views on Swachta Abhiyaan and message to youth?

I believe that the cleanliness campaign is most essential, not just for youth but for everyone. Suppose you don’t have the clean face. It changes your personality immensely. Suppose you walk into a room which is not cleaned. Though it is spacious and protected, the impression you get is that of an unclean room which demeans the other features totally. So, the biggest thing to be done for our nation, to improve its value and its image, is the cleanliness campaign. The second thing is that sometimes, simple things are more important. We are under impression that antibiotic medicines save lives; it is true, but clean water has saved more lives. One more example is that there are numerous cures available for malaria like the chlorine tablets, injections, the mosquito nets, etc. but how do the mosquitoes grow? Because of the dirt!! So, cleanliness is



the bigger cure to malaria.

So, to increase their value, their image and their self-esteem, the one campaign the youth should participate in is the ‘Cleanliness Campaign’.

Does the education system need to change? What needs to be added?

I believe that today’s education is a giant ship with huge defects. The ship cannot be changed nor can it be broken, but it needs to be repaired plank by plank. Further, Real Education is not only about having the right answers but also about asking the right questions. Education should give a person- his self-worth. A degree is not worth until it gives one one’s self-worth. Education can be summarized in three processes- knowing the world, knowing oneself and most importantly, knowing about the

spirit.

According to you, what are the two important qualities that today’s youth must inculcate?

According to my experience of travelling across the world and meeting different people, the two qualities the youth should have, should nourish and should sustain are – 1. Hard Work 2. Humility

There is no option to hard work. If you are a doctor and aspire to be the best doctor, you have to work harder. Then, to sustain your position, you have to work even harder. Once I called Mr. Kalam in the Rashtrapati Bhavan at 1:30 am and he was awake. That shows his dedication and justifies his hard work.

The second thing is humility. Both hard work and humility

- Cleanliness March organized on India's 66th Republic Day where more than 4000 members of GLS family took out a rally to create awareness about cleanliness and draw


public attention to sensitize the issue of cleanliness.

The first thing that they should change is their attitude-their carefree attitude. They should become responsible and should take themselves seriously.


The second thing that will help them is volunteerism. They should understand that one should not do things only if one gets paid for it. If one opens the doors for people, grows seeds or tries to help a peer, it is the virtue of volunteerism. They should

voluntarily help anyone in any way they can.

In your speech for the education of 21st century, you made a point that the most immediate challenge the colleges face is the issue of attendance.

Any suggestions by you in this regard.

There are so many distractions in today's world. Initially, when we used to teach children, they used to learn anything from the classrooms itself because there was no source of learning outside the classrooms. Now, because of the presence of Smartphone and Internet, they



believe that there is more to learn from outside than from classrooms. Thus, the need of the hour is that the colleges and classrooms should be made more interesting and more purposeful.

One related problem is that of Attention-deficiency in students. Even when they attend classes, they are not attentive. The main reason for this is the lack of proper preparation of the subject and proper involvement in the students by the professors.

So, attendance is to make our education more interesting; attention is to generate

recognize its importance and implement it too. Once Gandhiji was travelling in a train, a passenger accompanying him in the compartment was chewing paan and wanted to spit it out but the person did not go to the bathroom and instead tried to spit there itself. Gandhiji being very sharp understood his body language and immediately offered his hands to that person. The person got embarrassed and shy and told Gandhiji that "I'll wash your hands", as a reply Gandhiji said that "these are my hands I'll wash them myself". From this episode we need to understand that we don't have to do anything for anybody else. But we have to keep our own house, office and kitchen clean. Such incidents might have happened in our forefathers' lives many times and such should be shared with children. In the initial upbringing of kids they are told to be clean, to look good, but later when they grow they should be taught that good health comes from cleanliness and hence being an education minister, I look over this concept as important in education system.

Vibrant 2015 has been outstandingly successful, and is being talked about all over the world. What expectations do you have from vibrant for development of education in our state?

Vibrant Summit has been

started since 2003 at that time misleading publicity of Gujarat people did not come but there after gradually knowing about Gujarat; safety, peace and consistence rule of state government of Gujarat due to which till now in 2015 not only people from other states, all over India but also from abroad and so as for those from outside India make them like to come to

India. In this world, we are in developed countries people have civic sense that even if it's just a chocolate wrapper they don't throw it on roads rather they keep it into their pockets. So in order to attract more

and more foreign investments and tourism in return relating it to growth of our economy, through which we get employment and returns, even if he is rickshaw driver or any restaurant or hotel and this is only possible if we keep our Gujarat clean so they not only like to come but also like to stay, it should not happen that person came to Gujarat and goes to Mumbai just to sleep as it is not clean this should not happen. Vibrant 2015 has been the most successful summit since 2003 where about 25 lakh Rs investment is coming and in that situation during the 3 days summit it has happened first time since our independence that worlds biggest institutions and dignitaries were present; John Kery and Ban ki Moon as this is a pride taking moment



curiosity while retention is to make the children fall in love with the subject because "you only learn from the things you love".

How can we move towards harmony in the world? And how can youth participate in the process?

The first step would be to create fewer disturbances in the world. The youth or for that matter, anyone should not involve himself in such events and activities that imbalances the nature or other people's lives.

Second would be by giving space to oneself and the people. One classic example in this regard would be of a railway station. Looking from the

aerial point of view on the platform, there are thousands of people coming/going from both the ways-left and right but nobody collides. Further, when the train comes, hundreds of people climb up or climb down. Nobody knows each other; nobody stops to ask and nobody gives commands. Still, there is no collision. Why? Because psychologically, we give space to each other. We don't ask the one coming from the opposite side, to move right or left but we subconsciously understand that both of us want space. "If you keep giving space to everybody, you will reach where you want to without any collision i.e. harmoniously."

especially this word is being disliked now a days?

This is a question of great importance today and as an education minister myself I am very disappointed with the current scenario. When we see the students' activities within the campuses of universities, there is nothing like education or quality in education and we all know the rest that is going on, which should not happen because those who study well, enjoy a happy life. This may result in some leadership which is very beneficial for personal development and for the youth this not the time for mischiefs and indiscipline. This is the time for self-development and thus, time for developing a Nation, developing a country. And so far all those who have contributed to this were of ages between 18 to 38 years, be it Gandhiji, be it Sardar Patel, or be it Swami Vivekananda. In fact Swami Vivekananda ended his life at the age of 38 after contributing a lot. Now we all have these years he had and all we do is mischiefs, then how can we develop this nation. And we demand from this country to provide us with livelihood, shelter, clean water, electricity, etc. After wasting all this time we have how can we expect anything from the nation. All I expect from the young boys and girls is that they follow discipline strictly in life and by discipline I also mean politeness, love and unity.

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for me, what have my parents done for me, what has society done for me, but if we recall our freedom time span, ideology was what I have done for nation. At least make a commitment for your society, and if every individual follows it then whole nation follows it, hence in this generation it is necessary. While in reference to this I am happy to pin point that the criticist of Modiji's ideology, Amartya Sen has also said that there is a revolt and confidence evolved in our country, confidence is of doing something innovative for nation and this is a very good symbol for our nation. In this situation 65% of people with less than 35 years of age in this world are only found in India and for this reason I would like to appeal you all that at least make your work a mission, a motto and work together for the nation.

As a Minister of Education, what do you think is the importance of Swachhta in the process of education?

From pre-primary to primary and secondary to higher secondary in whole process teacher is the mediator. As we have discipline, regularity, determination, honesty similarly it is cleanliness "swachhta", hence until teacher does not understand importance of swachhta and implements it how can he convey its importance to students and motivate them conceptually everyday so that they can

for youth that such dignitaries stayed in our state for whole 3 days event. This is all for our coming generation not for anybody else and how they are benefited with it. When guests come to our house, preparations are according to the type of guest coming to our home and we our democratic and developing country and hence our core responsibility is cleanliness.

Do you think the urban-rural divide still exists? Does it impact implementation of programmes such as Swachhta Abhiyan and betibachao, betipadhao? How this gap can be reduced?

This won't happen in Gujarat because in last decade our PM Shri Narendra Modi took a pledge that he wants to facilitate villages with all those facilities available in the cities. He gave us a word that is not available in the dictionary of any of us. 'RURBAN'- which is a combination of Rural and Urban. He has combined these two words that with such a feeling that there will be facilities as that of the cities but soul will be of villages where there is cleanliness, where there is religion, where there is peace and unity, where there is love and trust. So there will be no urban-rural gap and this will happen smoothly throughout the state.

You have led an exemplary disciplined life yourself. What would you like to tell the youth about discipline,

બધા જીવપ્રાણીમાત્રમાં એક માનવ જ એવો છે જે પોતાના ભાવિ વિશેની ધારણા માંડી શકે છે કે એની તૈયારી શકે છે. માનવીની સમસ્યાએ છે કે તે પોતાની સામેના પડકારોને જાણતો હોવા છતાં એ બાબતે કાંઈ કરતો નથી! એક વખત એક પોલીસ અધિકારીના પત્નીએ તેમને જગાડીને કહ્યું “આપણી શેરીમાં કાંઈક અવાજ થયો. ચોર આવ્યા લાગે છે.” અધિકારીએ જવાબ આપ્યો “હું જાણું છું અવાજ મેં પણ સાંભળ્યો છે” થોડીવારમાં તેમના જ ઘરના મુખ્ય દરવાજાની સાંકળ તોડીને ચોર ઘરમાં પ્રવેશી ગયા. પત્નીએ ધ્યાન દોર્યું કે ચોર તો આપણા ઘરના ડ્રોઈંગ રૂમમાં ઘૂસી ગયા છે. તોય તે પોલીસ અધિકારીએ ઠંડે કલેજે જવાબ આપ્યો “હું જાણું છું” પછી તો ચોર ઘરની તિજોરી ખોલી ઘરેણાં રૂપિયા ઉઠાવવા માંડ્યા. પત્નીને એમ કે તેઓ ચોરોને રંગે હાથ પકડાવી દેશે. પરંતુ તેમ ન થયું. માલ-મિલકત લઈ ચોર નાસી ગયા. પત્નીએ પોલીસ અધિકારીને કહ્યું “ચોર આપણા ઘરમાં ઘૂસી બધું લુંટી ગયા, તમે જાણતા હતા તોય કેમ કાંઈ ન કર્યું” તે પોલીસ અધિકારીએ પ્રત્યુત્તર આપ્યો, “અત્યારે હું ફરજ ઉપર નથી!” આપણે પણ તે અધિકારીની જેમ ઘણું બધું જોઈએ છીએ, સાંભળીએ છીએ, જાણીએ છીએ પરંતુ વિચારીએ છીએ કે જે મારી ફરજમાં આવતું નથી તે કામ મારે શા માટે કરવું? ઘણી વખત લોકો એવું વિચારે છે કે હું નાનો માણસ એકલો શું કરી શકું? શું ગાંધીજીને જ્યારે આફ્રિકામાં ટ્રેનમાંથી બહાર હાંકી કાઢવામાં આવ્યા ત્યારે તેઓએ આવું વિચાર્યું હતું? આઝાદીની લડત બાબતે પણ ગાંધીજીએ એવું ક્યારેય નહોતું વિચાર્યું કે હું ઘરડો માણસ શું કરી શકું?

ભારતમાં વિશ્વના સૌથી વધુ યુવાનો વસે છે. ભારતની ૫૧% વસ્તી ૨૫ વર્ષથી નીચેની વય ધરાવે છે. અરે ૨૦૨૦ થી ૨૦૫૦ સુધીના વર્ષોમાં તો ભારતના નાગરિકની સરેરાશ ઉંમર ફક્ત ૨૭ વર્ષ જ હશે! યુવાનોને જ્યારે પૂછવામાં આવે કે તમને તમામ પ્રકારની સહાય આપવામાં આવે અને અભ્યાસની તક મળે તો તમે દેશમાં ભણવાનું પસંદ કરશો કે વિદેશમાં? જો દેશમાં અને વિદેશમાં કારકિર્દીની સરખી તકો મળતી હોય તો ક્યાં સ્થાયી થશો? દેશમાં કે વિદેશમાં? લગભગ બધા જ યુવાનો વિદેશમાં ભણવા અને કારકિર્દી રચવા તૈયાર થઈ જશે. તક મળે તો દેશ છોડી વિદેશ જવાની ઘેલછા ધરાવતા હોય તેવા ભારતીય યુવાનો આ દેશમાં બહુમતીમાં હોય તોય શું?

આપણા અનુભવો, મૂલ્યો, જ્ઞાન અને સંસ્કારો નૂતન પેઢીમાં સંક્રમિત કરવા તે જ સાચું શિક્ષણ છે. આદિમાનવે આ કાર્ય સફળતાપૂર્વક પાર પાડ્યું હતું. એણે પાયાની બાબતો જેવી કે દોડવું, સંતોઈ જવું, ખોરાક પ્રાપ્ત કરવો વગેરે પોતાના બાળકોને સફળતાપૂર્વક શીખવી હતી! એ વખતે અસ્તિત્વ ટકાવવા માટે એ બધું શીખવું વધારે આવશ્યક હતું. આજે વિશ્વભરમાં અનેક યુનિવર્સિટીઓ અને અનેક પ્રકારના અભ્યાસક્રમો ઉપલબ્ધ હોવા છતાં આપણે માનવજાતના ભાવિ વિશે આશંકિત છીએ.

વર્તમાન વિશ્વ અત્યાધિક ઝડપે બદલાઈ રહ્યું છે. એટલા ધરખમ ફેરફારો કે જાણે પાંચ જ વર્ષમાં એક



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આખી પેઢી જ બદલાઈ જાય! આરંભના વર્ષોમાં કમ્પ્યુટરસ આખા રૂમ જેવડા વિશાળ હતા. પછી ડેસ્કટોપ આવ્યા. ત્યારબાદ લેપટોપ, થર્મટોપ અને હવે બાયોલોજીકલ સેલ્યુલર! માહિતીનો ભંડાર સાચવવા હવે બેકટેરિયાનો ઉપયોગ થશે! આવનારા દિવસો ડીજીટલ ક્રાંતિના દિવસો હશે. સ્માર્ટ રસ્તાઓ, સ્માર્ટ ઘરો, સ્માર્ટ મશીન્સ, સ્માર્ટ મીરર્સ, સ્માર્ટ ગ્લાસીસ. બધું જ સ્માર્ટ, કનેક્ટેડ અને ઓટોમોટીક! વિજ્ઞાનની આ ક્રાંતિથી બધું જ ત્વરિત અને સ્વચાલિત હશે. પરિણામે માણસ તો સાવ હાંસિયામાં જ ધકેલાઈ જશે!

હવે રૂઢિગત શિક્ષણ પદ્ધતિ, સંસ્થા અને અધ્યાપકોનો યુગ પૂરો થઈ ગયો છે. શિક્ષણ આંગણમાંથી વર્ગખંડોમાં, વર્ગખંડોમાંથી કમ્પ્યુટરમાં અને કમ્પ્યુટરમાંથી સાયબર સ્પેસના યુગમાં પ્રવેશી ચૂક્યું છે. આ સંદર્ભે અધ્યાપક પણ વ્યાખ્યાતામાંથી માર્ગદર્શક, તેમાંથી પરિક્ષક અને છેવટે નીરિક્ષકની ભૂમિકામાં પહોંચી રહ્યો છે. આ સંજોગોમાં શિક્ષણના ત્રણ પાસા પર ધ્યાન કેન્દ્રિત કરવું પડશે.

૧) મૂળભૂત રીતે શિક્ષણ એટલે વિચારશક્તિનો વિસ્તાર

વિચારશક્તિને કારણે જ આપણે ગુફામાંથી સ્માર્ટ હોમ્સ તરફ પ્રગતિ કરી શક્યા છીએ. બરછટ કાચા ભોજનમાંથી ભાતભાતના સ્વાદિષ્ટ રસથાળ સુધી ગતિ કરી શક્યા છીએ. પરંતુ અફસોસ! પ્રાણી જગતના એક પણ પ્રાણી પોતાના સંતાનની કેળવણી બીજાના હાથમાં સોંપતા નથી. તેઓ પોતે જ પોતાના સંતાનોને કેળવે છે. જ્યારે માનવ એક જ એવો છે જે પોતાના બાળકોનું ઘડતર બીજાઓ કરે તેમ ઈચ્છે છે! જો મા-બાપ પોતાના એક-બે કે ચાર સંતાનોનું ઘડતર કરી ન શકતા હોય તો એક શિક્ષક સો વિદ્યાર્થીઓનું ઘડતર કરી રીતે કરી શકે?

આપણી વર્તમાન શિક્ષણ પદ્ધતિ ઍંગ્લો-જર્મન એજ્યુકેશન મોડેલ પર આધારિત છે જે ઔદ્યોગિક યુગમાં જે-તે સમયની જરૂરિયાતને આધારે રચાયું હતું. જ્યારે આપણી પ્રાચીન શિક્ષણ પદ્ધતિમાં વિદ્યાર્થી ગુરુકુળના નૈસર્ગિક વાતાવરણમાં નદી, પર્વત, ઝરણા, વૃક્ષો અને પશુ-પંખીઓના સાન્નિધ્યમાં અભ્યાસ કરતો અને એ વખતે શિક્ષણ અનુભવ પર આધારીત હતું. રસ્તે ભૂલા પડીએ ત્યારે જાતે રસ્તો

શોધવા જતા આપણે વધુ ભટકી જઈએ છીએ. જ્યારે બીજાના માર્ગદર્શનથી તરત સાચો માર્ગ મળી જાય છે. પારિવારિક સમસ્યાઓનો ઉકેલ એકબીજાના સહકાર અને મદદ વિના શક્ય નથી. રમતગમતમાં હંમેશા ટીમવર્કની જીત થાય છે. અરે તમામ મહાન સિધ્ધિ સંપન્ન અને એકતાથી-સહિયારા પુરુષાર્થથી જ પ્રાપ્ત થાય છે. જ્યારે વર્તમાન શિક્ષણ કેવળ વ્યક્તિગત કૌશલ્ય અને ક્ષમતાને કેન્દ્રમાં રાખે છે. અને તેથી એને બદલીને એવી વ્યવસ્થાનું નિર્માણ કરવું પડશે કે જેમાં પરસ્પર સહકાર, સંવાદિતા અને સંપત્તિ ભાવના દૃઢ થાય.

આપણી વર્તમાન શિક્ષણપ્રથામાં શિક્ષકનું પ્રદાન ખૂબ મહત્વનું છે તેણે સતત સજ્જતા પ્રાપ્ત કરતા રહેવું પડશે. પોતે ઉદાહરણરૂપે બની વિદ્યાર્થીઓમાં જિજ્ઞાસા અને રચનાત્મકતાને પ્રોત્સાહિત કરવી પડશે. એલ્વીન ટોફલરે સાચું જ કહ્યું હતું “૨૧મી સદીમાં કેવળ તેઓ જ અભણ નહી ગણાય કે જે લોકો લખી કે વાંચી શકતા નથી પરંતુ જેઓ નવું નવું શીખી નથી શકતા તેઓ પણ અભણ ગણાશે.”

૨) અનુભૂતિ કરવાની ક્ષમતા :

જ્યારે વિચાર કરીએ ત્યારે સમજાય છે કે વિદ્વતા કે બૌદ્ધિક ચર્ચા નહીં પરંતુ સામાજિક અને સાંસ્કૃતિક લાગણીભર્યા સંબંધો આપણને જીવનમાં સાર્થકતાનો અનુભવ કરાવે છે અને આત્મગૌરવ તથા આત્મસંતોષ પ્રદાન કરે છે. જો માહિતી અને કૌશલ્યની સાથે સંવેદના અને સહાનુભૂતિ ભળશે તો જીવન સંતુલિત બનશે. એ વિના તજજ્ઞો તબીબો અને વિજ્ઞાનીઓ પણ વિનાશ જ સર્જશે. આજે યુવાનો લાગણીશૂન્ય અને પરિણામે દિશાશૂન્ય બન્યા છે. શાળા-કોલેજોમાં વિદ્યાર્થીઓ હિંસક બનતા જાય છે. ક્યારેક ખ્યાતનામ યુનિવર્સિટીના ગ્રેજ્યુએટ્સ વિનાશકારી પ્રવૃત્તિઓમાં સંડોવાયેલા જોવા મળે છે. આવા સંવેદનશૂન્ય શિક્ષિતોની પેઢી તૈયાર કરતા શિક્ષકો અને અધ્યાપકોએ હિટલરના કોન્સન્ટ્રેશન કેમ્પમાંથી બચી ગયેલા વ્યક્તિનો પત્ર જરૂર વાંચવો રહ્યો:

“પ્રિય શિક્ષક,

હું કોન્સન્ટ્રેશન કેમ્પમાંથી બચી ગયેલ વ્યક્તિ છું. (ત્યાં) મારી આંખોએ જે જોયું છે ભગવાન કરે કોઈને તે જોવાના

દિવસો ન આવે! (નિર્દોષોને રાસાયણિક ગેસથી ગૂંચળાવી મારી નાખતી) ગેસ ચેમ્બર્સ બનાવનાર નિષ્ણાત ઈજનેરો હતા. શિક્ષિત તબીબોએ બાળકોને જેર આપ્યું હતું. નાનકડાં ભૂલકાંઓની હત્યા તાલીમબદ્ધ નર્સોએ કરી હતી. શિશુઓ અને સ્ત્રીઓને હાઈસ્કુલ અને કોલેજના સ્નાતકોએ જ બંદૂકની ગોળીઓથી હણીને બાળી નાખ્યા હતા. અને તેથી શિક્ષણ બાબતે હું શંકાશીલ બન્યો છું. મારી આપને વિનંતી છે કે આપના વિદ્યાર્થીઓ વધુ માનવીય બને એ માટે આપ એમને મદદરૂપ થજો. આપના પ્રયત્નોથી ક્યારેય શિક્ષિત દૈત્યો, કુશળ પાગલો અને વિદ્વાન અસુરો ઉછરે નહી તે ખાસ જોજો. વાંચન, લેખન અને અંકગણિત ઘણા મહત્વના છે જો તેનાથી આપણા બાળકોને વધુ માનવીય બનાવી શકાય તો!”

૩) આત્મશ્રદ્ધા અને ભગવાનમાં શ્રદ્ધા :

જો આપણે કોઈક બાબતમાં શ્રદ્ધા ધરાવતા હોઈશું તો ચોક્કસ તે માન્યતા આપણી જીવનશૈલી બદલશે અને બદલાતી જીવનશૈલી આપણું વ્યક્તિત્વ અને ભાગ્ય બદલી નાખશે. અમેરિકાના વિજ્ઞાનીઓએ જેના માર્ગદર્શનથી એપોલો મિશન્સ અને બીજા ૩૩ અવકાશી સંશોધન પ્રોજેક્ટ્સ પાર પાડ્યા તે મહાન વિજ્ઞાની વોન બ્રોન કોઈ ધર્મોપદેશક કે સંત નહોતા છતાં એમણે કહ્યું છે “જ્યારે માનવજાતના હૃદયમાં ભગવાન પુનઃ સ્થાપિત થશે ત્યારે ભગવાનની કૃપાથી પ્રાપ્ત થયેલ નૈતિક અને મૂલ્યનિષ્ઠ માર્ગદર્શનથી ટેકનોલોજીકલ ક્રાંતિથી ઉદ્ભવેલા ખોફનો સામનો કરી શકશે?” જો વિજ્ઞાનના ક્ષેત્રે મૂલ્યનિષ્ઠ અને નૈતિક બળની જરૂર પડે તો શૈક્ષણિક ક્ષેત્રે પણ તેની આવશ્યકતા છે જ.

AC અને DC કરન્ટને પરસ્પરમાં રૂપાંતરિત કરવાની ટેકનીક શોધનાર વિખ્યાત વિજ્ઞાની ચાર્લ્સ સ્ટાઈનમેટ્સને પૂછવામાં આવ્યું કે આપની દૃષ્ટીએ આગામી ૫૦ વર્ષમાં વિશ્વમાં કયા ક્ષેત્રે પ્રગતિ થશે? ત્યારે તેમનો જવાબ હતો “આવતા ૫૦ વર્ષોમાં સ્ત્રીઓ અને પુરુષોને ભાન થશે કે ભૌતિક વસ્તુઓ સાચુ સુખ આપી શકે તેમ નથી. અને જ્યારે એવો દિવસ આવશે ત્યારે વૈજ્ઞાનિકો એમની પ્રયોગશાળાઓને પ્રાર્થના ખંડો અને ભગવાનના

ઉપાસનાખંડોમાં ફેરવી નાખશે. અને ત્યારે હાલ જે પ્રગતિ ચાર પેઢીઓ જેટલા સમય ગાળામાં થઈ છે એટલી પ્રગતિ આપણે એક જ પેઢીમાં જોઈ શકીશું.”

હાલ આપણે ઓળખની સમસ્યા (આઈડેન્ટિટી ક્રાઈસીસ)નો સામનો કરી રહ્યા છીએ. જ્યારે આપણે વચ્ચુંઅલ બનીએ છીએ તો આપણે કોણ છીએ એ જ સમજાતું નથી. ઘણા બધા વચ્ચુંઅલ આઈડેન્ટિટી આપણી સાચી અને સમગ્ર ઓળખ કઈ? એક વાર યુરોપની સફર દરમ્યાન ચાર્લ્સ ચેપ્લીન જેવા દેખાતા લોકોમાં સૌથી વધુ કોણ ચાર્લ્સ ચેપ્લીનને મળતો દેખાવ ધરાવે છે તેની સ્પર્ધા હતી. રમૂજ ખાતર ખુદ ચાર્લ્સે તે સ્પર્ધામાં ભાગ લીધો તો તેનો ક્રમ સાતમો આવ્યો! આ બાબતે તે પોતાના સંસ્મરણોમાં નોંધે છે “આપણે એવા વિશ્વમાં વસીએ છીએ જ્યાં બનાવટી લોકો સફળ થાય છે જ્યારે સાચા માણસો હારી જાય છે. અરે! પળવાર તો મને એવું થયું કે હું જ ખરો ચાર્લ્સ ચેપ્લીન છું કે મારી આગળ આવેલા પેલા છયે વિજેતાઓ? જ્યારે હૃદયના ઉડાણમાં જઈ જોયું તો મને ખાત્રી થઈ કે હા, હું જ ખરો ચાર્લ્સ ચેપ્લીન છું અને એથી જ મને ખૂબ રાહતની લાગણી થઈ”
